### ANSWERS

#### Patting a dog is okay while it is in a harness

FALSE - A Guide Dog is a working animal, not a pet. Please do not pat it or distract it in any way, particularly when the dog is in harness.

## Introducing yourself to the guide dog owner is a nice thing to do.

TRUE - Introduce yourself to the Guide Dog owner – imagine if you were a Guide Dog owner and people spoke to the dog and ignored you!

#### Feeding a guide Dog is not a good idea.

TRUE - Food of any kind is a definite NO. Do not tempt the dog with food at all. Make sure that food is out of the dogs' reach (put lids on canisters and bins).

### You can play with a guide dog when it is with its owner.

FALSE - When the Guide Dog is not working, it is usually best if it is left quietly to have a rest.

# Guide dogs are allowed on public transport , in shopping centres , in restaurants

TRUE - Remember that Guide Dogs are legally allowed in shops, restaurants, motels, theatres and regularly travel on all forms of public transport, including taxis. It is *illegal* to refuse a Guide Dog entry to a public place. This is in accordance with the Disability Discrimination Act of 1992 and the Dog Act of 1976.

## You can ask the guide dogs owner questions about their dog.

TRUE - A Guide Dog owner is usually only too happy to tell you about his or her Guide Dog and how they work together. You just need to ask.
